Gives you a voice. The volunteer committee represents the approximately 2.3 million people who live and work with the <u>Arizona's 9,800 community associations</u>. The LAC works to stop or modify proposed bills that increase costs, are unnecessary and/or interrupt the enjoyment of communities.

Keeps you informed and involved. Contributions provide necessary resources to organize effective "grassroots" advocacy campaigns. Getting the support of Legislators for HOA issues involves letters, emails, phone calls and attending hearings to support or opposed bills.

Tracks legislation that could impact community associations. In 2023, the committee reviewed 40 bills that directly or indirectly impacted community associations >> www.caionline.org/LegislativeTracking

Strengthens key relationships with lawmakers. Meeting with Legislators are foundational to garner their support or opposition prior to a bill having a hearing or full vote of the House or the Senate. It requires solid hearing testimony based on data and meetings with Majority Leadership and staff to apprise them of any amendments that impact CAI's support or opposition to a bill.

Advocacy Successes. Thanks to the LAC's efforts, several amendments to key bills impacting community associations are currently being introduced that could potentially affect the community association industry in 2023:

Bills Supported by CAI:

<u>SB1456</u> – creates a defined list of what constitutes a "financial or other record of the association," and establishes new requirements for records' requests reducing frivolous or burdensome requests.

CAI also supports SB1023 and SB1384

Bills Opposed by CAI:


<u>HB2251</u> – requires condominium associations to carry property insurance for all the individually owned condo Units, and limits the Unit owner's responsibility for the property insurance deductible to no more than \$10,000, significantly increasing the association's liability exposure and reallocating the Unit owner's responsibility for property damage inside their Unit to all of the other Unit Owners as a common expense.

<u>SB1470</u> - makes the association's automatic statutory assessment lien subordinate to the homestead exemption rendering the assessment lien largely unenforceable unless home equity exceeds \$250,000.

CAI also opposes HB2301, SB1034, SB1049, SB1358, and SB1387
